

Local medical charity, Camphill Wellbeing Trust (CWT), launched Compass in September 2020 to transform the former Waldorf School site on Craigton Road into a centre demonstrating practical solutions for healthy and sustainable lifestyles. Thanks to the support of our **local community** and over **5586 hours** donated by **515 volunteers**, our project continues to grow.

We are delighted to confirm our polytunnel, funded by **The National Lottery's Together for our Planet Award**, has been granted planning permission and is now up ready for use. This new growing space will provide an area for bringing on seeds, potting up plants and for growing produce needing some protection in our NE climate, such as tomatoes, cucumbers and peppers.



We have a wide variety of fruit and vegetables already growing outside, some almost ready for harvesting. Unfortunately, we have had a number of dog fouling incidents in our fruit and vegetable growing areas. While we welcome walkers passing through the site, **please make sure to keep all dogs on leads** so our growing areas remain safe and pleasant for all!

Volunteers have recently taken part in #30minworms by **uksoils** who promote soil science



skills in the community. An earthworm survey of Compass has been submitted to the project to help determine local populations of worms across the country. The site is also taking part in Scotland Wildlife Trust's Saving Scotland's Red Squirrel initiative.

Compass also welcomed participants of **NESCAN's Climate Week North East** onsite

for an afternoon of learning about beekeeping, composting, wormeries and no-dig gardening methods this April. Despite the wet weather, we received positive feedback from the event: *"I enjoyed the wormery and no-dig workshops. Great event, staff were very knowledgeable and I'm excited to start the no-dig method at home."* If you'd like to learn more about our methods, come along to one of our volunteering sessions – the best way to learn is by doing!

[Tales from the Riverbank by Robert Harper](#)

2023 River Dee spring salmon fishing season, February to end of May, has been disastrous once again, an extremely poor return of spring fish, the crisis deepens, not only on the Dee but for many Scottish rivers. On the Dee we now await to see if the summer run of salmon and grilse materialises, we can only hope.

The urgency how the salmon crisis would be looked into by the Scottish Government fell completely flat, their urgency and words meant nothing, as I was well warned they would be, but having attended a meeting April 2022 at the Lower Crathes fishing hut, where the River Dee was very well represented, the Association of Fishery Boards in Scotland and others attended, with the main player Mairi Gougeon MSP for Rural Affairs, now a Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs, Land Reform and Islands, present. I believed her words and urgency, it was as though she cared and wanted to help the River Dee, the RURAL AREA and ECONOMY, but now I truly fear for our wild salmon industry and countryside ways of life, to my knowledge Mairi Gougeon hasn't even had the decency to respond to any correspondence regarding the April 2022 meeting, saying that the same can be said for many of the other local MSP'S who either just don't respond or ignore if you write to them, they have their own agendas. Interestingly on television the other night, and it looked like the interview was at Park bridge, a gentleman from

SEPA was saying how there was to be conservation areas designated around some of the salmon fish farms on the West Coast of Scotland, these fish farms have been an environmental disaster for so many years on the West Coast, scandalous it's taken so long for action. To finish, the River Dee has been a designated Special Area for Conservation for Salmon, Otter's and Fresh Water Mussels for many years, two of the three are acknowledged to be in crisis, yet an SAC means nothing to the Scottish Government, another scandalous situation, in my opinion wild salmon and Fresh Water Mussel's, have very little chance of survival, I am very saddened to say.

[SIR ISAAC NEWTON: A DURRIS LINK!](#)



Sir Isaac Newton

I suspect that there will be few readers of this article who have not heard of Isaac Newton – one of the most famous and influential scientists of all time. What few readers may be aware

of is that had it not been for someone with links to Durris, we might never have heard of Newton. The key person here is the 17th century laird of Durris - Sir Alexander Fraser. Sir Alexander was educated at Aberdeen University, received his medical training at Leyden University in Holland and Montpellier University in France and admitted as a Fellow of the College of Physicians in 1641. With his reputation rapidly increasing he was promoted to be one of the principal physicians to Charles I in 1645. With Charles I's execution in 1648 Fraser fled to Holland where he presented himself to Charles II who appointed him as his physician. It has been claimed that Sir Alexander played an important part in the formation of the Royal Society which comprised the most learned men in the country at that time. The Society was formed in 1660 and included such men as Christopher Wren, Samuel Pepys and Isaac Newton. Fraser played a critical role in the life of Newton by enabling him to retain his place at Trinity College, Cambridge. What is the evidence to support this claim? Whilst Trinity College was quite relaxed as far as most of its regulations were concerned, it was insistent that anyone wishing to continue as a fellow of the College, had to become ordained into the Anglican Church. But Newton was unwilling to be ordained even though he knew that such a refusal would lead inevitably to him having to leave Cambridge.

There was a possible solution. The statute with respect to ordination could be set aside by a royal dispensation. In 1674 a student at Trinity College had attempted to obtain a dispensation of the kind that Newton sought. However, it was the view of the Master of Trinity College that such a dispensation, if granted, would undermine the principal purpose of the college which was the creation of clergymen. The Master was confident that such a dispensation would be refused and so it proved.

There is in existence the draft of a letter written by Newton to Sir Alexander thanking him for his support for the dispensation. It is worth noting that Sir Alexander's son, Charles Fraser, had been elected to a fellowship in Trinity in 1673 and would have known of Newton and his unique abilities. By 1675 Newton had almost given up hope of remaining at Trinity College. Then at the last moment the situation changed. On the 2nd March 1675 and with the full support of Charles II, a draft of a special dispensation was sent to the Attorney General for his opinion. On the 27th April that dispensation was granted and because this was a Royal Act it could not be challenged. The point should be stressed that ample evidence shows that Sir Alexander was more than just a personal physician to Charles II but a close confidant. If Sir Alexander had made a strong case for granting such a dispensation, Charles II would have listened.

Why was Newton so opposed to being ordained into the Anglican Church? One tentative answer has been advanced and that is that around 1672 Newton had become an Arian. The Arian doctrine, first proposed in the 4th century by Arius, stated the belief that Jesus was more than man but less than God. In other words, Arians did not believe in the identification of God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Ghost, so they did not believe in the doctrine of the Trinity. Newton

believed that the Roman Catholic Church was misguided in its interpretation of Christianity and had returned to idolatry and whilst he partly approved of the Protestant Reformation, he felt it had not gone nearly far enough to return Christianity to its original state.

Holding heretical views of this kind would almost certainly have led to him losing his post at Trinity College. There is a certain irony in the fact that Newton in rejecting the concept of the Trinity nevertheless remained a fellow of the *College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity!*

Had Sir Alexander not intervened and had Newton not remained at Cambridge, the scientific world would have been deprived of the thinking of one of the world's greatest scientists. The laird of Durris perhaps merits belated recognition for the importance of his intervention.

[Ready to refresh at Crathes Hall](#)

Following the lifting of the final Covid restrictions last year, things have returned with a bang at Crathes Hall.

Since June 2022 there has been a steady influx of functions, fitness classes and events at the Hall which has made us one of the busiest in the Shire, averaging about 120 hours of hire use per month, which is hugely appreciated by the Trustees and the Community.

Over the course of the last year, we have had 31 children's parties, 10 band rehearsals, 9 funeral teas, 4 craft fairs and a wedding amongst a variety of other bookings as well as ongoing regular hires. Throughout lockdown and the early part of 2022, a



small group of Trustees were working hard to progress the project to build the new Hall for the Community. As the years wore on it became increasingly apparent that sources of funding were few and far between especially when it was apparent that lockdown and other factors had caused the price of materials and labour to increase to a point where the build cost for the new Hall had risen by an estimated 80 %.

At a Trustees meeting in November 2022, it was agreed that the new Hall was not a realistic proposal at this time, so the decision was made to stop the project and instead, turn our attention to refurbishing the existing Hall. The decision was circulated to and supported by the Community.

Since then, work has been ongoing to clarify what requires to be done to secure the Hall in the short and medium term with one eye on potential long-term improvements. Surveys undertaken by Business Energy Scotland have identified ideas that when implemented will enable the Hall to run far more efficiently than before and at reduced costs. The report also opened sources of funding that were not otherwise available to the Trustees for the new Hall project.

The upshot of this work means that the Hall will be closed from early July until the 10 August this year to allow works to be carried out to treat areas of wet & dry rot, install insulation in the walls, install new windows, new fire doors and to paint the building inside and out.

As far as possible the works that have been quoted for have been awarded to local trades to further enhance the Community engagement of the Hall. Outside the Hall, work has already started. A work party in early June, with the help of a large digger(!), moved the plants and soil from a flowerbed beside the Hall to an area at the opposite end of the car park where it is hoped the flowers and plants will flourish.

Work has also been ongoing to finalise the purchase of the 2.2 acres of Station Wood, the area of trees that surround the Hall car park on the south side of the A93.

With a grant from the Scottish Land Fund, the transfer of ownership is being processed and is hoped to be completed soon.

It is hoped that in the fullness of time the area can be used by the Community for outdoor learning, environmental development and maybe picnics!

As for ongoing events, regular updates are posted on the Crathes Village Hall Facebook page as well as the website www.crathes-hall.co.uk keeping everyone posted with what is coming up.

For those that would like to be added to the Hall mailing list, please make use of the "Join Us!" button on the front page of the website where you can become a member of the Hall. It doesn't cost anything and doesn't commit you to anything; it just ensures you are notified of upcoming events at the Hall.

We are entering an exciting period for our beloved Hall. It is only with the help and support of the volunteer Trustees and members of the Community that we will ensure the Hall remains a valued and cherished facility for generations to come.

It's been another busy quarter for the Community Council, with a vast array of topics on the table. There doesn't seem to be a week go by without one of us being out and about attending meetings, be that meeting residents to discuss ideas and suggestions as well as concerns, to meeting with representatives from local organisations and officers from the council, there's plenty happening just now and whilst it's not all positive news, there are so many great things happening in the Community, we are thoroughly enjoying being part of them.

Our usual work on items such as; our ongoing Road Safety Campaign, our fight to re-open Park Bridge, our work to improve issues at The Glebe and trying to implement developments for the communities with the likes of our Path Network project and delivery and installation of several new Defib units across the area, as well as keeping up to speed with the communities opinions and plans

for the proposed Hill of Fare Windfarm and the proposed new overhead powerlines by SSEN is what keeps us so occupied.

I'm sure you can imagine for a small group of volunteers it's no mean feat, and any support we can get from members of the community to assist us with any one of these matters is really appreciated – you don't have to join the Community Council to support us. We have several people who work with us on some of these projects purely to do their bit support our endeavours and make a difference for the community and we'd love to have more of you do the same.

[Defibrillation Units](#)

One of our Community Councillors, Shaun, has worked very hard over the last few months, pulling together funding, to deliver a project to install more defibrillation units across all of our

With funding from both the Meikle Carewe Wind Farm Fund and Aberdeenshire Councils Kincardine & Mearns local budget, we have been able to purchase an additional 4 Defibrillation units which is fantastic news.

We're also very grateful to the support receive from Ener-G Services, who have very kindly agreed to install these units for us, which has been a fantastic support.

The locations of these new units are Crossroads Nursery – Durriss, Durriss Primary School – Woodland of Durriss, Sunnyside Construction – Park, The Hair Hut – Drumoak.

We continue to fund local projects through the Mid Hill Windfarm community fund, with two progressing currently for the Drumoak and Durriss Community Group. [Road Safety Update](#)

Our regular meetings with Aberdeenshire Council on our Road Safety project continue to be ongoing. It's been great to see that so many of the concerns raised through our Road Safety Campaign in late 2021 being looked at and in most cases, actions taking place. At the last meeting, we were provided with an update that the speed limit in Kirkton of Durriss will be lowered to 40mph, which is a great result after many years of campaigning. There are many other good results, perhaps too many to list here, but we will try to find a way of conveying the results thus far in the near future.

Tying in nicely to Road Safety, our work on building a path network between our communities continues. We've recently held meetings with a few of the landowners, to see how they can support us in improving safety in communities as well as developing leisure opportunities, with the provision of paths. We will shortly be on the lookout for support from residents to form a group that can actively help support, volunteer, create and maintain path networks in our area, like we see in other surrounding areas.

[Proposed New Overhead line by SSEN.](#)

By now we hope that you are aware of SSEN's proposals to install a new overhead line, running through the heart of our community. Many of you have contacted us to make us aware of your opinion which is great, please continue to do so. The big ask we have however, is to ensure that you respond to your local councillors, MSP's as well as SSEN during any consultation periods and should any planning permission be submitted to ensure your voices are heard, it's really important that whatever your opinion, you take the time to fill in the form, write the email or submit the feedback, please don't assume your opinion will already be known or that it won't make a difference.

[Park Quarry](#)

We visited the JKR (formerly Chap) quarry this month to see progress on reinstatement. We were pleased to see considerable material on the west side where reinstatement has begun. It will take some considerable time though as 80% of the material brought in is recycled, with the remaining 20% going to reinstatement. Extraction is virtually complete with just a small area left. JKR's lease from Chap is for a period of 10 years (8 ½ to go) and reinstatement is due to be complete by then. However, we can't forget that Chap may still have a proposal for Kincluny Village (1500 houses) in the pipeline and it is anticipated that this will be revived as soon as reinstatement is complete and JKR clear the site.

[Park Bridge](#)

The structural assessment of Park Bridge is due for completion now and Aberdeenshire Council have been contacted to find out the status. The assessment has not yet been received by the council and an update on the timing of it is awaited.

[Hill of Fare Windfarm Proposal](#)

By the time you read this, it is likely that the next - and final - round of public consultations on the Hill of Fare Windfarm proposal will have taken place. However, the closing date for comments is not until 06 July, so we would encourage you to make any comments known to RES by then. You can do this by emailing Gavin Shirley, Project Manager, at gavin.shirley@res-group.com. Previously, the development was planned to include 17 turbines, each 250m in height. RES has amended the design which now shows the turbine tip heights being lowered from 250m to a mix of 180m and 200m turbines, and turbine numbers being reduced from 17 to 16. This is a significant proposal for our area which requires careful consideration. The survey results from the last round of public consultations illustrates that 76% object to the proposal, with 15% undecided, 4% neutral, and 6% in favour. In majority terms therefore the community was strongly opposed to the proposal as it was described at that time. Please note that comments submitted to RES by 06 July are not representations to the determining authority (The Scottish Government's Energy Consents Unit), they are for the purposes of communicating your opinions with RES alone. There will be an opportunity to submit


representations to the determining authority once a planning application has been submitted, which we expect will be later this summer.

HOMEOWNERS – IMPORTANT NOTICE

In February 2019 the Legislation relating to smoke detection in your home changed.

 - All fire alarms are to be ceiling mounted and must be interlinked.
- Carbon monoxide detectors are to be fitted where there are carbon fuelled appliances (such as boilers, fires, open fires, heaters, stoves, or a flue).

The Regulations came into effect in February 2022.




